INCLUSION AND DIVERSITY IN SCIENCE: A CASE STUDY OF NIGERIA

In 2022, I was honored to receive a Diversity in Science grant to execute the project titled "Inclusion and Diversity in Science: A Case Study of Nigeria." While facing challenges in securing additional funding, we were determined to carry out the project within the available resources.

Our project began with a 30-day awareness campaign focused on promoting diversity and inclusion in the field of science. Participants included students from various schools across Nigeria, academics, and scientists. To effectively convey our message, we created graphic designs and videos highlighting themes of diversity, inclusion, and equity. These materials were shared extensively on our social media platforms, including Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and Instagram. Additionally, members of the Pharmafluence Education Advancement Network (PEAN) generously contributed by reposting these materials on their WhatsApp status updates.

As a significant part of our campaign, we organized a webinar that featured Dr. Leila Neshat Mokadem, an Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Champion and Senior Lecturer at the School of Pharmacy, Robert Gordon University, United Kingdom. Her inspiring insights motivated participants to become EDI ambassadors within their respective educational institutions. We were delighted to receive overwhelmingly positive feedback from the participants, who recognized the timeliness of our campaign and its role in reinvigorating their commitment to the principles of EDI.

Upon the successful completion of our campaign, two female members of PEAN had the opportunity to attend the 2023 International Women's Day Celebration hosted by the Women Initiative for Sustainable Environment (WISE). The event's theme, "Embrace Equity," aligns closely with our project's goals. PEAN generously covered the registration fees and logistical expenses for this participation.

The grant funds were also allocated for essential purposes, including covering the Zoom subscription cost for our webinar and the expenses associated with the creation of awareness materials such as posters and videos.
